DEATH OF FR. DAVID ANDRADE: On Wednesday of this past week, the priests of Christ the King parish joined with others of the Diocese to concelebrate the Funeral Mass of Fr. David Andrade, pastor of St. Louis de France Parish in Swansea. At age 57, Fr. David fell victim to the rather severe flu epidemic we are experiencing this year, and having developed complications from it, consequently has been taken from us before his time. Please pray for Fr. David and the parish of St. Louis which is now without a pastor and for Fr. David's mother, Augusta, who at 96, is being asked to bear a terrible loss as Fr. David was her only child and she had come to rely greatly on his attention and assistance in these her later years.

FLU PREVENTION PRECAUTIONS: Fr. David's death is tragic in many ways, but it would be rendered senseless if we don't heed the warning it provides us; the flu this year is very dangerous, especially to younger children and those who are "Baby Boomers" and older. So, let us as a community of faith, take precautions to avoid it. If you feel ill, even slightly so, with aches and fever, etc., please stay home from Mass and watch it on live stream instead! Here at Mass, we would be wise to refrain from shaking hands as we extend a sign of peace to one another; note well, that doesn't excuse us from the exchange of peace - just from the form it will take. Nodding, smiling, gesturing while saying "peace be with you" is perfectly appropriate way to participate in the sign of peace and indeed prudent at this time until the flu epidemic is over. Additionally, we will restrict reception of the Blood of Christ via the common cup to the priest and the deacon until the danger of the flu is well passed.

FOOD FOR THE POOR: This interdenominational Christian Charitable Organization is extremely well rated and well known for its effectiveness in helping to feed, house, and educate the poor throughout the Caribbean and Latin America. Its chief goal is to bridge the Christians of the first world with those of the Third who are in such great need. Dr. Nicholas Matas, a parishioner, who has participated in a mission trip to Guatemala sponsored by Food for the Poor, will be speaking to us briefly at all the Masses this weekend to prepare us to adopt a housing construction project in Guatemala as a recipient of our Lenten almsgiving, along with Catholic Relief Services and our own St. Vincent de Paul Society.

LENT: The 40 days of Lent officially begin to be counted with the FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT which is February 18th this year. However, Lent has its own preparatory days which by tradition actually start on Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, known as Mardi Gras or Carnavale, and most significantly, Shrove Tuesday. As the day to be "shriven", meaning to have one's confession heard by a priest, Shrove Tuesday invites us to pause in order to take a long hard look at ourselves and admit before God in sacramental confession how we are failing to keep his commandments. Then, on the following day, Ash Wednesday, we are able to truly receive ashes as an outward sign of our inner willingness to put to death in us all that is contrary to the Gospel, because we have taken the time and made the effort to identify and confess these failings already. Lent then can become what it is meant to be, the penance for sin we confessed on Shrove Tuesday, which when carried out faithfully over 40 days, has the potential to truly transform us. The remainder of the days of the week from Ash Wednesday until the First Sunday of Lent are days to listen to the scriptures chosen for each day as these provide a clear picture of what God expects of us in Lent. The days from Ash Wednesday to the First Sunday are also

called the “porch of Lent” and are days on which to fast if one is to suspend fasting on the Sundays of Lent, as is proper. Then, having been Shriven, signed with ashes, practiced fasting, and instructed, we are ready by the First Sunday to begin to live a fruitful and effective Lent.

MOTHER TERESA of Calcutta by *Francine Bay, illustrated by Emmanuel Beaudesson*. This new book for readers nine years old and up, faithfully follows adult biographies of Mother Teresa from her birth in Albania to St. Peter’s Basilica in Rome where in 2016, she officially became what many already called her, a saint. Beautifully rendered full and double-page illustrations accompany the text.

THE CHURCH OF MERCY: A Vision for the Church by *Pope Francis*. By now, the world has become accustomed to seeing Pope Francis bring a message of inclusion and mercy to the far-flung corners of the world.

A proclamation of mercy has special significance to this Pope who has chosen as his papal motto: *miserando atque eligendo*, which refers to Christ’s encounter with the tax collector, Matthew. : “*since he sees by having mercy and by choosing.*” He asks Matthew to follow him. The text is taken almost entirely from homilies and general audiences and thus, retains a conversational and spirited tone.

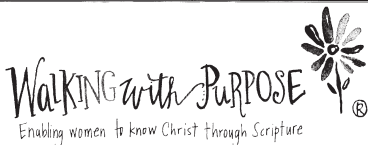
