PASSIONTIDE:

According to a long standing tradition these last two weeks before Easter which include the end of Lent and the Sacred Triduum have been known as Passiontide. While not exclusively, our focus now begins to shift a bit from our own efforts at deeper conversion to that of re-appreciating all that Jesus of Nazareth was willing to suffer for our sake, the rejection by the religious authorities, his arrest and his condemnation to death. Next Sunday is Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion – when we will bless palms to remember the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem to accomplish our salvation and read the Passion according to St. Matthew. So we move now toward the holiest days of our year which will require our whole hearted attention and participation. True to long standing Christian tradition we are asked to set aside one day each week (Sunday) and one week each year (Holy Week) which are to be dedicated to the Lord. This is not too much to ask given that God has given us life itself and allotted us all our days and weeks to live it, but even more, has promised us life eternal, and sent his son to gain that for us by his own passion, death and resurrection. So let us use the coming week to prepare ourselves to make the following week, beginning with Palm Sunday and ending with Easter Sunday truly holy by personal prayer and liturgical participation. Let us get our errands done and clear our social calendars so that free of mundane tasks and obligations, we will be available to spend Holy Week in a way that is significantly different from the other 51 weeks of the year.

PALM SUNDAY (of the Lord's Passion) Palms will be blessed during the opening rites and distributed at all Masses next weekend as we remember the Lord's triumphal entrance into Jerusalem. Our proclamation of the Passion According to St. Matthew will then remind us that the entrance into Jerusalem was for the purpose of accomplishing the work of redemption through his passion and death.

The 10:30 AM Mass will begin with the Palm Sunday procession as is traditional at the principle Mass of that day. Thus those who are able are asked to assemble in the parish hall for the opening of the 10:30 AM Mass where the palms will be blessed and the first Gospel proclaimed, then (weather permitting) we will process outside from the Hall to the main entrance of the Church and begin the liturgy of the word upon our arrival.


