## Remembering from Mountain Top to Tomb:

It may be hard for us to imagine the joy of Christians when in the years following 313AD the effects of the Emperor Constantine's Edict of Milan began to be felt throughout the Roman Empire. One great effect of which we can be certain was the freedom finally to worship quite publically, and thus the major churches of the Holy Land and Rome in which Christian liturgies were to take place were built.

By the mid fourth century we know that the Christians of Jerusalem had developed special liturgies to embellish their already long standing tradition of annually remembering the Lord's Passover from death to life in the very city where these events had taken place just three centuries earlier.

So Holy Week as we now know it began to take shape – as on Palm Sunday the Christian faithful gathered with their clergy at the village of Bethany to begin a procession that would move down the slope of the Mount of Olives, past the site of Gethsemane, across the Kidron valley and on up through the gates of Jerusalem and on to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher within the Old City walls for the celebration of Mass. Indeed the Solemn Entry into Jerusalem was always commemorated with a procession which took the path that the Lord himself had followed into the Holy City to complete the saving work he had been sent to perform by undergoing his passion.



So by a tradition now nearly 1700 years old, Holy Week begins with a Palm Sunday procession. In every church at least one procession is to be held at one of the principal Masses and for our parish this is the 10:30 AM Mass this Sunday which begins in the Parish Hall with the reading of the first gospel and (weather permitting) then continues with a procession outside and then enters the front of the church where once inside the liturgy of the word, in particular, the reading of the Passion and the celebration of the Eucharist takes place. Once we have "entered into Jerusalem" we will then continue our journey from mountain top to supper room in Golgotha and to the tomb, not in an annual historical reenactment but in the liturgical remembering which is known as anamnesis by which the events of Christ's own passion and death are made present to us that we may have a share in their saving effects.

So this is the time when once again we must struggle against temptation to minimalism by not asking ourselves what is the least we have to do to fulfill our religious duty and ask instead with sincerely grateful hearts what it is that we can render to God in return for the great and completely undeserved gift of eternal life. The answer is simple; to remember and give thanks for the great price Christ paid for our salvation on one day each week and this one week each year. Indeed this is the one week each year which informs us of the cause of our pausing to remember and render thanks each Sunday: the life giving passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. So let us plan our schedules accordingly so as to be where any believing Christian would truly want to be during this coming week which is at the liturgies that make present the events that accomplished our salvation.

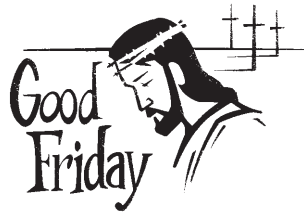
