**WORLD DAY OF THE SICK:** February 11th, The Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, is an annual day to pray for the sick, but as that feast is pre-empted by Sunday this year, we will devote the **8:30 AM Mass on Monday, February 12th**, to prayer for any who are sick, and invite those chronically or seriously ill to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick during this Mass. Those who wish to be anointed are asked to fill out the forms provided at the entrances to the church and return these as you are anointed so that the administration of the sacrament can be recorded as required by church law.

**THE SEASON OF SELF DENIAL:** We are about to begin our participation in the annual Paschal Season with the 40 days of preparation for Easter, that we call Lent.

The purpose of Lent is to facilitate our ongoing conversion by inviting us to unite ourselves more closely to the dying and rising of Christ. As Christ gave of himself completely, offering his very life on the cross in order to free us from final death, we are called to imitate him in bringing life to others by “dying” to ourselves.

So, this special season, encourages us to overcome self-concern by self-denial, thus Lent is traditionally a season of fasting and sacrifice as penance for our sins and as a means of being a blessing to others. Our Lenten fasting cannot ever be fasting for the sake of fasting alone, but should be a fruitful fast in that it enables us to be more generous with others because we have denied ourselves. So, the things we might choose to deny ourselves, perhaps an evening cocktail, a daily stop at the coffee shop, a dinner out, meat, or other luxuries, entertainments or treats, enable us to have more resources to share with others in need.

Thus on Holy Thursday as Lent ends, we will gather with the whole community with whom we have been fasting for 40 days, and bring the fruits of that fast to be offered to God at Mass in the form of money saved by our sacrifices to be given to the charities we have identified as a parish; The St. Vincent de Paul Society, Catholic Relief Services, and the El Tablon Project of Food for the Poor. So, let us discern what it is we are willing to deny ourselves in order that others may better live and by this, unite ourselves to Christ who on the Cross held back not even his life's breath and blood in order to defeat death and win us the hope of a better life, indeed, eternal life.

**THE SIGN OF ASHES:** By a very long and ancient tradition ashes are an outward sign of an inner desire to repent and that is how they should be received, never casually or thoughtlessly, nor out of mere custom and especially not out of superstition. The ashes themselves are only ashes, they have no power to change us, only our inner desire to change and thus our willingness to submit ourselves more wholeheartedly to the

workings of the Holy Spirit can accomplish our further conversion. Thus, it is also our tradition that we examine our consciences and confess our sins before receiving the ashes on Ash Wednesday, in order to assure that this outward sign is not an empty one.

For this reason, this Tuesday is traditionally known as "Shrove Tuesday" from the old English term for absolution.

Confessions will be heard on Tuesday from 3 to 6 PM in the Church, in preparation for Ash Wednesday.

Ash Wednesday, along with Good Friday, are days when the whole church is asked to fast in solidarity together.

Fasting on these days is defined as taking only one meatless meal.

## Parish Library Reviews



**MOTHER TERESA of Calcutta** by Francine Bay, illustrated by Emmanuel Beaudesson. This new book for readers nine years old and up, faithfully follows adult biographies of Mother Teresa from her birth in Albania to St. Peter's Basilica in Rome where in 2016, she officially became what many already called her, a saint. Beautifully rendered full and double-page illustrations accompany the text.

**THE CHURCH OF MERCY: A Vision for the Church** by Pope Francis. By now, the world has become accustomed to seeing Pope Francis bring a message of inclusion and mercy to the far-flung corners of the world.

A proclamation of mercy has special significance to this Pope who has chosen as his papal motto: *miserando atque eligendo*, which refers to Christ's encounter with the tax collector, Matthew. : "since he sees by having mercy and by choosing." He asks Matthew to follow him. The text is taken almost entirely from homilies and general audiences and thus, retains a conversational and spirited tone.

*Dear Parishioners and Fellow Brothers,*

On February 26th, the Knights will be sponsoring the 1st blood drive of the year. I would like to share a few fun facts and figures on blood needs in the US.

1. Every two seconds, someone in the US needs blood.
2. Approximately 36,000 units of blood are needed every day in the US.
3. Nearly 7,000 units of platelets and 10,000 of plasma are needed daily.
4. Nearly 21 million blood components are transfused each year.
5. The average red blood cell transfused is about 3 pints.
6. The blood type often used is type 0.
7. Blood used in an emergency is already on the shelves before an event happens.
8. A single car accident victim may require as much as 100 units of blood.
9. According to the American cancer society, more than 1.6 million people are expecting to be diagnosed with cancer in 2018, many of them will need blood, sometimes daily, during their chemotherapeutic treatment.
10. We are a small part of the nations number of units used, but just as important. The Cape Cod hospitals are in need of blood everyday for the people, (our friends, family) who use the ER or undergo heart surgery right here on Cape Cod. So, please give the gift of life when ever possible.

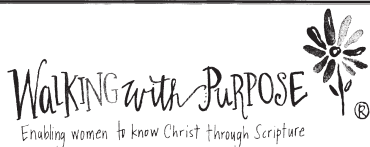
