JESUS: A Biography from a Believer by Paul Johnson. Today there are over one hundred thousand printed biographies of Jesus in English alone. More than one hundred were issued in the first decade of the twenty-first century. So what can this biography by best-selling author of A History of Christianity and many other highly praised non-fiction works add?

For this reader a chapter on "Poetry and Parables, Questions and Silence" brought the gospels to life. Other readers have been intrigued by "Jesus's New Ten Commandments". This book, new to your library, is recommended both for those who may be reading their first biography of Jesus as well as for those who have read many before.

THE LIFE OF GEORGE WASHINGTON CARVER, A DVD. In an age of so much bad news, this story of a black man born into a segregated society and challenged by poverty, frailty, sickness and the KKK is a breath of fresh air.

Carver overcame these obstacles by seeing setbacks as blessings and learning opportunities. Through perseverance, a passion to help all mankind rooted in a deep Christian faith and the help of good people, he became one of the world's foremost experts in horticulture. Not least of all, he invented peanut butter!
