WHY WE DO WHAT WE DO AS CATHOLICS; SPONSORS: If someone wishes to become a member of a private club or a fraternal, civic, or charitable organization, they often need a sponsor, someone already a full member of that club or organization who will sponsor them for membership. It is assumed that the sponsor knows the customs and rules of the club and takes responsibility to pass these on to the person they are promoting for membership. So too, is it with the church, new members need to be sponsored by someone who is a full and active member of the church.

According to church law, only one sponsor is required, but that sponsor should be a fully initiated (baptized, confirmed, and having received the Eucharist) and practicing (Mass and Communion each Sunday) member of the church.

Just as you cannot have someone who quit the country club or who never has belonged, sponsor you as a member, then why would some think the church should allow a not fully initiated or now inactive member to take the role of sponsor for initiation? The problem comes not with the Church's theology as it is sound concerning sponsors for baptism and confirmation, but with our contemporary culture where even irreligious celebrities name "godparents" for their children even when there is no baptism to take place at all. Godparent is the customary name that has been given to sponsors for baptism, especially when there are two, a man and a woman. In fact, while only one sponsor is required by church law for baptism, when there are two, it must be a man and a woman, not two men or two women. Today, much tension and trouble is created over the issues of sponsors as contemporary culture clashes with church law and long standing tradition. Godparent is a role that is often promised to relatives and friends based on their relationship to the parents of the child to be baptized rather than that person's relationship to Jesus Christ and the church. When persons proposed as godparents are not fully initiated and/or regularly active in the church or not members at all, then they truly do not qualify to represent the church in sponsoring new members. Nor are inactive Catholics likely to be able to fulfill the true duty of a godparent which is to assist the parents to raise the child in the practice of the Catholic faith. If parents want their child to learn to play the piano, then they would not be likely to hire a tennis coach as the teacher, so why ask someone who isn't Catholic to sponsor a child into the Church and to take some responsibility for that child's future development in the church's faith and practice?

Refusing someone as a sponsor is not a subjective judgment about their personality or morality, it is rather an objective judgment about their lack of qualifications in terms of their own reception of the sacraments of baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist and their present level of participation in Sunday Mass on a regular basis.

As our culture becomes increasingly secular and less sincerely religious, the future integrity of the faith requires that only qualified sponsors prepared to pass on the faith be permitted as godparents, otherwise the population of "baptized unbelievers" can only continue to increase exponentially. (This series is examining what have become controversial issues in Church policy and practice).

DVD: MIRACLES FROM HEAVEN: *Based on the incredible true story of the Beam family.* When Christy discovers her 10-year-old daughter Anna has a rare, incurable disease, she becomes a ferocious advocate for her daughter's healing as she searches for a solution. After Anna has a freak accident, an extraordinary miracle unfolds in the wake of her dramatic rescue that leaves medical specialists mystified, her family restored and their community inspired.

BOOK: WHEN BREATH BECOMES AIR: *Paul Kalanithi.* At the age of thirty-six, on the verge of completing a decade's worth of training as a neurosurgeon, Paul Kalanithi was diagnosed with stage IV lung cancer. 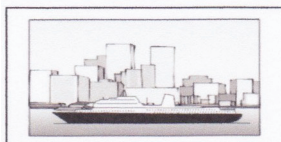
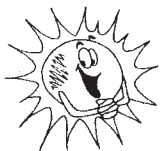
