GETTING MARRIED IN CHURCH:

(3rd in a series on Catholic customs that are becoming controversial).

References to "walking down the aisle" which most people readily associate with getting married, indicate how deeply rooted is the notion that marriages are properly celebrated in church.

Yet, not so much anymore, when the state now allows anyone to get a license to be an efficient for a day and marriage ceremonies are just as likely to take place under a gazebo at the same venue as the reception, or on a beach or in a park.

Yet, getting married "in church" has a deeper significance than describing the location in which vows are exchanged, but rather indicates the long tradition of regarding marriage as a sacred act that rightly takes place in a sacred place.

The one sacrifice of Christ on the cross is the ultimate act of perfect love in that He laid down His life without limit or condition in order that we might have life in its fullness.

This is the sacrificial love we celebrate at every Mass, and in which we have communion in order that we might be strengthened to also lay down our lives in service of others in imitation of Christ.

What then is the meaning of Christian Marriage but the laying down of one's life for the good of one's spouse by which married persons become living signs (i.e. sacraments) of the love of God as revealed in the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross.

Thus the theological foundation of Christian marriage is best respected when a couple exchanges their vows at a Mass in a Church, or if a Mass is not appropriate due to denominational differences of the couple, then at least before the altar where the community of faith regularly remembers and celebrates the total self giving of Christ.

Perhaps, it is a diminishment in the overall appreciation of what we do at Mass and why we do it that is leading some Catholics to miss the essential connection between the Sacrament of Eucharist and that of Marriage.

Yet, whatever the reason for the contemporary trend that would permit couples to think that there is no difference in getting married at the beach with a relative, friend, or judge officiating, rather than before an

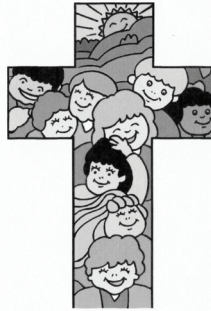
