CATHOLIC TEACHING:

(4th in a series of things Catholic that are becoming controversial).

The church has a very long history, and therefore, abundant experience in all matters pertaining to human life and living and thus has a teaching about nearly every important issue, be it religious, moral or social based on the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Yet, as society changes its teachings on many matters, the church seldom, if ever, does and so it can be seen as rigid and unbending, and sadly as irrelevant, especially to those who feel they cannot live up to what church is asking.

Indeed, misunderstanding why and how the church teaches can create unnecessary problems and alienation.

Unlike an Anglo-Saxon approach which states the minimum and expects all to comply, the church took root in a Roman or Latin culture where ideals are essential, and so, are defined and then are promoted in all things

including moral norms, laws, literature, art and music.

The ideal is set before people without compromise as something for which to strive, yet at the same time, accepting the reality that not all will always be able to attain it.

One example of this that has become clearer but subsequently more controversial in recent times is that of marriage.

In the ideal marriage, is the indissoluble union between a man and a woman which is its complementary aspect reflects the total image of God and in its permanence is a sign of the unending love of God.

In its procreative potential marriage, is a sacrament of the outpouring of divine life and love in all of creation.

Yet, this sacramental concept of marriage cannot be attained or sustained by everyone for a whole host of very real human reasons.

For those who can't enter marriage or maintain it, there must be compassion and mercy, yet dispensed in such a way that the ideal of marriage is not ever compromised.

This sort of mercy is a constant theme of Pope Francis, who in promoting this longstanding practice in the church's pastoral ministry is not always well understood by those with a more minimalistic rather than idealistic framework.

In the very least, the sacrament of penance is always available as a remedy for those who cannot live up to the ideal in this or any other aspect of life about which the church teaches. So, let us support the church as it sets ideals before us, and let us strive to live up to these as best we can, and when we fail to do so, let us not reject the truth of the ideal and walk away from the church, but rather remain in the church's merciful and forgiving embrace - finding in it a true sacrament of the mercy and compassion of God.

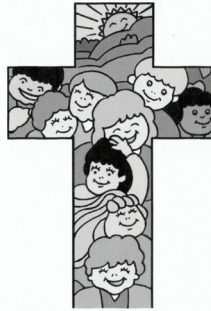
