We Can Pray: In the face of scandal in the church we often do not know quite what to do, but the first thing we should do is pray because ultimately a just resolution, conversion of mind and heart, a firm purpose of amendment, healing and forgiveness are dependent upon God. So our Bishop, Edgar da Cunha, will conduct a Holy Hour before the Blessed Sacrament to pray for reparation and healing in the Cathedral Church in Fall River on this Friday evening, **October 5th, from 7-8 PM.** Bishop da Cunha asks that a simultaneous Holy Hour be held in each Deanery of the Diocese with similar prayers for the same purpose.

On Cape Cod, the **Holy Hour will be here at Christ the King Church** and it will be live streamed through our Web Site. As this is the First Friday - our regularly scheduled adoration will be held as usual throughout the day and evening in St. Jude Chapel. The adoration will continue until 7 PM when the Blessed Sacrament will be returned in procession to the Main Church for the Holy Hour from 7-8 PM which will conclude with Benediction. All are encouraged to come and to pray for the healing of victims, the repentance of perpetrators, the sound judgment of Bishops, the just treatment of victims and those accused, indeed that all the good things of God - wisdom, compassion, mercy, justice, conversion, repentance and forgiveness, will bring light to the darkness of sin and scandal, abuse and injury so that God's grace and peace will reign even in the midst of it all.

Blessing of the Animals: As the Church celebrates the annual Feast of St. Francis of Assisi (October 4), we remember this great Saint's love for all creation and his unusual ability to communicate even with various animals. It is therefore traditional to bless animals on or near St. Francis Day. All pet owners are welcome to bring their leashed or caged pets to the lawn in front of the rectory before the image of St. Francis **at noon next Sunday, October 7th.** The blessing is simple and brief, so please, plan to arrive by noon in order for your pet to receive the blessing.

We Are Family Campaign: Thanks are again due to the **281** households of the parish who have already contributed **\$161,860.** to our annual collection. The funds from this campaign are used for extraordinary maintenance and improvement projects such as our recently completed resurfacing of the parking lots and the future re-shingling of the roofs. At present, we are also installing security cameras in the Religious Education section of the parish complex and are in the process of having two new signs created for the property because those presently standing have deteriorated through moisture damage. It is hoped that all households of the parish will be as generous as possible to this important annual fundraising effort.

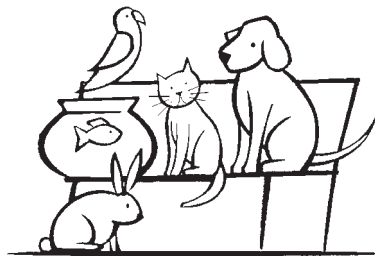


