THE VALUE OF CATHOLIC SCHOOLS: Social research reveals that the members of the younger generation are twice as likely as those of the older generation to self identify as atheist. Among Baby Boomers, 75% identify with some form of Christianity, Catholic or Protestant, yet only 59 per cent of Generation Z would do the same.

Further research shows that apart from the age old problem of evil, or the broad brush accusation that "church people are hypocrites," it seems that religion's perceived incompatibility with science is truly a major factor in the rising tide of unbelief among the young.

While public education has clear advantages over parochial schools especially in terms of the variety of programs that can be offered because of the funding that is available, yet one of the great advantages that Catholic Education has is that religion and science can be taught side by side.

The result is that Catholic School Students are taught that as much as science is a search for truth then it is a search for God who is Truth itself, and thus they are far less likely to see the two pursuits as in opposition to one another.

In a Catholic School classroom the faith of Gregor Mendel, or Copernicus and many other scientists does not have to go undisclosed, nor do the gaps in science as an explanation for all that exists have to remain unexamined.

This weekend **FACE - the Foundation to Advance Catholic Education** will hold an annual brunch to fund raise for scholarships to Catholic Schools in our diocese as this is the only way many students can afford to attend.

Yet the brunch is not the only way to support this worthy organization and so those who have interest in doing so should visit the organization's website.

We might ask ourselves what is the sort of a world in which we would want our grandchildren's generation to live, one that is ever increasingly faithless, or one where faith is well integrated into everyday living bringing Gospel values to bear upon life's bigger questions?

Let us renew our appreciation of Catholic Schools as an effective tool in cultivating a practical and enduring faith and lend them our encouragement through our support.

BLESSING OF THE THROATS: Having blessed candles for the Church's use at the **Candlemas Mass on February 2nd**, the Church uses these on the **Feast of St. Blaise, February 3rd, for the traditional Blessing of the Throats** which will be offered after each Mass on this weekend. *Kindly remain in the Church until after the recessional hymn if you wish to receive this blessing.*

SAVE THE DATE: Russ Breault, who devotes himself to educating people on the **mysteries of the Shroud of Turin** will be among us once again on **Saturday, March 2nd at 2PM in the Parish Hall**. Surely the topic which ultimately points to Christ's Passion is very timely as we are about to begin the **Season of Lent on Wednesday, March 6th**.

PREPARING TO FAST?: The 28 days from **February 5th to March 5th** is a suitable time for planning a meaningful and fruitful experience of the 40 days of Lent.

With that in mind, it is suggested that those who are called to make fasting a primary part of their Lenten journey might consider participating in the Daniel Fast, a whole foods, mainly meatless, way of living Lent that is a blessing to the body as well as the spirit; more details to follow.
