Feast of the Baptism of the Lord: Today we conclude the Season of Christmas - a season during which we revisit all the various early manifestations that Jesus, born at Bethlehem, raised at Nazareth is indeed the Word Made Flesh, the fulfillment of the promise of Emmanuel, God with us.

The conclusion of Christmas on this feast day is fitting because the Voice from Heaven, over the Jordan at his baptism by John will affirm the true identity of Jesus as God's unique, only, and most beloved Son.

Yet the baptism is both an ending of "the hidden years" and a beginning of the three year public ministry of Jesus where by his preaching and his healing activity we will learn what it truly means to have God with and among us.

The Baptism of the Lord is also a reminder to us of the purpose of our own baptism, which makes us beloved children of God, brothers and sisters of Christ, and so is also an inauguration of our public ministry as well by which we continue the work of Jesus Christ by proclaiming the gospel he preached in word and in action.

So today we will invite all those who serve in the many ministries of our parish to renew their commitment to these important endeavors as is only appropriate, but we must take care that it not confuse or excuse any of us, whether involved in a formal ministry or not, of our tasks as the baptized believers in Jesus Christ, to demonstrate our discipleship not only in words but in our deeds as well.

Matthew 25 Fund: The Matthew 25 Fund has been created to receive the charitable donations made to the parish for the care of local people in need. The distribution of the funds in the account are overseen by a board of advisers to insure that they are properly spent according to the donor's intent.

The Matthew 25 Account provides the funds that are used by the CTK St. Vincent de Paul Conference in their management of the Parish Food Pantry and in their providing assistance with housing, utilities, transportation and other essentials to those they have carefully vetted and have determined to be truly in need of this help.

The Matthew 25 Fund provides the opportunity for all of us to answer the gospel call made in the 25th Chapter of St. Matthew's Gospel to recognize Christ in those around us who are in need of our help.

At present it requires an average of \$13,000 per month to fund the operation of the weekly Food Pantry and to meet the basic needs of the poor.

Contributions to the Matthew 25 Fund can be placed in the collection basket in an envelope marked "CTK- Matthew 25", or with a check made out to the parish and the same intention written on the line provided.

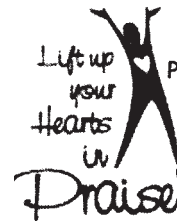
