A Grandmother's Wisdom: Just this past week I attended a funeral for a cousin of my father held at a funeral home.

There was a Congregational Minister presiding but it wasn't a service to which we as Catholics might be accustomed.

However, I was there with a few other relatives and we were participating because in spite of religious differences, we had stayed on good terms across the decades.

One can imagine the stir that was created back in the early 50's when this cousin met a devout Protestant and when they went to marry, they planned the service in a Congregational Church.

Many among the extended family had a lot to say about this situation and generally it wasn't good, after all, only two generations before our original ancestors had left Ireland in the face of mistreatment of Catholics and lack of opportunity for them at the hands of English Protestants which fueled their desire to emigrate.

Now one of their own grandchildren was becoming a "left hander", thus many refused the invitation to attend the wedding.

However, my own grandmother told her three sons that they would all be attending no matter what the other relatives had decided to do because a short service in a non-Catholic Church was not going to change their religion, but their absence could cause a lifetime of hurt feelings that may never be healed.

So, against the advice of their parish priest, and with the disapproval of the wider clan, my father with his brothers and their then widowed mother attended the wedding.

As we well know, a decade and half later the cold war between Catholics and Protestants in general truly started to thaw in the aftermath of the Second Vatican Council, but the hurt feelings between this cousin and some of the extended clan never fully did.

How wise and truly Christian of my grandmother to have done the loving thing in spite of opposition. Certainly, we all attend weddings now in other denominations without a second thought, but the envelope keeps getting pushed further as some young people opt for no religious service at all marrying on beaches and in all sorts of venues often rather disappointing to their more devoutly Catholic family members especially grandparents, god parents and parents. Yet when asked, as from time to time I am, what should we do in the face of such situations – my grandmother's wisdom still remains best, do the loving thing and avoid a lifetime of hurt feelings, and the rest is best entrusted to the heart of a merciful God.

Men's and Women's Conference- Saturday, March 9th: Parishioners are encouraged to register through the parish office at a cost of \$25 which includes the registration fee and bus transportation from the parish to Stonehill College and back on that day.

The conference will feature Bishop Robert Reed of Boston Catholic Television, Dr. Mary Healy, Scripture Scholar from Sacred Heart Seminary in Detroit and Deacon Pedro Guevara- Mann of Canada's Salt and Light Media. Bishop da Cunha will be the principal celebrant and homilist at the closing Mass. This is a great opportunity to start Lent in a spiritually enriching way and all are encouraged to attend.

The Holy Land: Having been there this past October for the 12th time, it is a place that still calls me back and in particular only increases my desire to expose as many people as possible to this the "Fifth Gospel" as a means of better coming to know Jesus Christ by becoming acquainted with the places he lived and visited, the climate, the culture and the cuisine with which he was familiar. Therefore, should there be sufficient interest, (25) I will organize another pilgrimage there in February of next year, 2020. The pilgrimages are not less than 10 days in length which amount to 2 travel days and 8 "on the ground" usually split between the Galilee region and that of Jerusalem. The cost is usually between \$3500 and \$3800, including flight, hotel and many meals.

February before Lent begins, tends to be a quieter and less crowded time to make a pilgrimage. Kindly indicate your interest by informing the office and further information will be forth coming.
