PASSIONTIDE: Today on the Fifth Sunday of Lent, we begin Passiontide – the final two weeks of Lent. During this time, we prepare ourselves in a more solemn and prayerful way to enter into the solemn celebration of Christ's passion, death, and resurrection.

Next Sunday on Palm Sunday, we will read from the Passion according to Saint Luke, and on Good Friday, the Passion according to Saint John. Now more than ever, let us make the final push to ready ourselves by fasting, prayer, and good works to prepare for Holy Week!

STATIONS AND A SIMPLE SUPPER – FRIDAY, APRIL 12: On this final Friday of Lent, the Stations of the Cross will be prayed at 5 PM in the Main Church, and immediately following, a simple meatless meal will be served in the Parish Hall.

As Fridays in Lent are a day of abstinence from meat and a day recommended for fasting, we are invited to do that in solidarity together at this meal, and the free-will offering requested is intended to cover the cost of the meal, with the remainder going to our three charities designated to benefit from our almsgiving this Lent: Matthew 25, Catholic Relief Services, and the El Tablon Housing Project of Food for the Poor.

ONE WEEK A YEAR: For the tremendous gifts of time and eternity, we are asked to make a return to the Giver! Six days of the week are ours for work, study, commerce, sports, entertainment, and chores, but one belongs to the Lord who gives us life and the time to live it and so on that day we devote our time to worship, recreation and rest.

Recreation is an activity that restores us rather than depletes us; it is never an activity from a "business as usual" kind of day! Fifty-one weeks of the year are ours, but one is marked out as belonging to the Lord who has purchased endless life for us with the gift of His own life. So, if we haven't done so already, let us mark our calendars now and eliminate all unnecessary commitments from Sunday, April 14th to Sunday, April 21st so that through communal worship, fasting, personal prayer, sacred silence, scripture and spiritual reading, we may make that week in reality what it is called: HOLY! These are the most beautiful liturgies of the year – please join us!

HOLY WEEK – SACRED TRIDUUM SCHEDULE

PALM SUNDAY – APRIL 13/14: Palms will be blessed and distributed, and the Passion according to St. Luke will be proclaimed at all Masses.

The 10:30 AM Mass on Sunday will begin from the Parish Hall, where palms will be blessed and the Palm Sunday Procession will form and move to the Church.

MONDAY OF HOLY WEEK – APRIL 15: Mass – 8:30 AM. Confessions - 3 PM to 6 PM.

TUESDAY OF HOLY WEEK – APRIL 16: Mass – 8:30 AM & 5:30 PM (Chapel). Contemporary Stations of the Cross presented by the ECHO Community in the Church – 7:00 PM. A beautiful and moving presentation to add to your Holy Week Journey.

All are welcome! (At 4 PM at the Cathedral in Fall River, the Bishop will bless oils and the priests will renew their promises at the Chrism Mass).

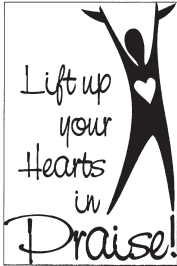
