A Month Of Remembering Many Martyrs: June began with the feast of Justin the Martyr of the Second Century and as we come to the end of the month we will have celebrated nine feast days of martyr's and as some of these like the Ugandan Martyrs of the 19th Century, and the First Martyrs of Rome in the middle of the First Century we are reminded of the courage and unshakable faith of many who would give up even their very life before denying Jesus Christ or violating his teachings. On Monday, we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Apostles Peter and Paul, who were martyred during the persecution of Nero. This feast has been faithfully celebrated in the City of Rome, beginning some five decades even before the Edict of Milan in 313 AD finally broke any ban on the public practice of Christianity in the Roman Empire. Why are the Martyrs so important to us? Because, to a person, they gave an example of what true faithfulness to Jesus Christ might have to cost us all. Yet, fortunately, in our day and in our region of the world, actual martyrdom is unlikely, but we have seen it in places not so far away nor unfamiliar to us, like Libya, where in 2015 a group of 21 Coptic Christian men was beheaded by radical Islamists. For us today, a similar challenge is faced not literally as a matter of life or death, but often as a matter of social acceptance or rejection. Indeed, there are plenty of opportunities in the contemporary culture where, like the martyrs, we can either stand up for the faith and the teachings of Christ's gospel when they are being questioned or ridiculed, or we can cave to social or political pressure to remain silent so as not to be dismissed or rejected by others. What will it be for us? Are our eyes open to the affairs of our nation or those of this world that clearly contradict the Gospel? Do we have the courage to challenge trends in the culture that are sanctioned by "everyone is doing it," even though we know these to be morally wrong? When Henry VIII broke from the Church of Rome in 1535 and named himself supreme head of the Church in England to divorce Catherine of Aragon and marry Anne Boleyn, there were 21 bishops of dioceses and 26 abbots in the House of Lords. Yet most all acquiesced to the King in silence to preserve their own position and power. It was primarily Bishop John Fisher, whose feast is observed on June 22nd, who had the moral integrity and courage to say that only the Pope as successor of St Peter, can be the chief shepherd of the Church that is authentically founded on the Apostles by Jesus Christ and also said he was willing to die if necessary to defend the



Well, Bishop Fisher died on the scaffold on June 22, 1535, but his example of moral courage lives on, along with his good name, while those without the same conviction and courage are remembered in disgrace or are otherwise completely forgotten! As we conclude this month of feasts celebrating the witness of many martyrs, let their example of upholding the truth that comes from God and defending the Church that proclaims it inspire us to do the same, no matter the cost to us!

Close of the Annual Catholic Appeal: The end of June brings with it the end of the Catholic Appeal, an annual request from our Bishop to assist him financially to assure that the apostolates, ministries, and programs sponsored by the Church of Fall River will not only continue but flourish in the fiscal year ahead. Thank you to the 281 households that have donated or pledged to the Catholic Appeal already, may those who have not yet done so be inspired by the Holy Spirit and the good example of others to do something to support these good works and thus be part of something greater than themselves and of benefit to many.

National Eucharistic Pilgrimage: In celebration of the nation's 250th birthday, a National Eucharistic Pilgrimage is being held from May 24-July 5 and will include different routes with stops in 18 dioceses, including the Diocese of Fall River from June 29-30. The theme of the pilgrimage is "One Nation Under God," and the particular route, which began in St Augustine, Florida, and will stop in our Diocese on the way to its end in Philadelphia, PA, has been dedicated to St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, the first U.S. citizen to be canonized. Opportunities to take part in the pilgrimage as it travels through our Diocese include Masses, Eucharistic processions, and Adoration in Easton, New Bedford, and Fall River. Please check the schedules provided at the entrances to the Church or available on the website of The Diocese of Fall River and plan to participate as we all pray for our Church, diocese, and country on this significant anniversary of the signing of our Declaration of Independence as a nation.
