The Pastor's Pen

THE WEEKLY COLUMN BY FR. EDWARD HEALEY



250 Years; Celebrating America the Beautiful and Challenging America the Heartless: In 1883, Emma Lazarus composed a poem for the fundraising efforts to create a pedestal for the Statue of Liberty in New York Harbor. The poem is now permanently enshrined on a bronze plaque in that pedestal. Entitled "The New Colossus", it reads as follows:

*Not like the brazen giant of Greek fame,
With conquering limbs astride from land to land;
Here at our sea-washed, sunset gates shall stand
A mighty woman with a torch, whose flame
Is the imprisoned lightning, and her name
Mother of Exiles. From her beacon-hand
glows world-wide welcome; her mild eyes command
The air-bridged harbor that twin cities frame.
"Keep, ancient lands, your storied pomp!" cries she
with silent lips. "Give me your tired, your poor,
Your huddled masses yearning to breathe free,
The wretched refuse of your teeming shore.
Send these, the homeless, tempest-tost to me,
I lift my lamp beside the golden door!"*

This poem sums up quite well what has been and should continue to be the promise of America as a refuge where the poor, the tired, the oppressed of the world might finally find a home in which they would first and foremost be free and in that climate have every opportunity to prosper. Surely this is what happened for the majority of our forebears who arrived here from the British Isles, or the continent of Europe, because they sought better lives for themselves and those who would come after them, and for many America has surely delivered on that promise. Yet ironically, as we celebrate the 250th Anniversary of the founding of our nation, and the freedoms and opportunities generations of our families have enjoyed, we are faced with the uncomfortable truth that recent waves of immigrants coming for the very same reasons as our own ancestors, or fleeing even worse forms of poverty and oppression, are no longer finding the welcome that the Statue of Liberty represents and America promises. The present administration had campaigned on the slogan "Mass Deportation" and painted newcomers with the broad brush

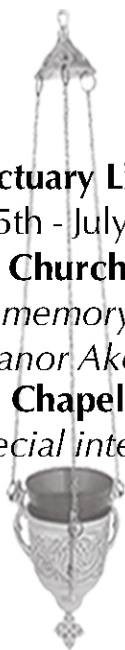

of criminality! Not yet having the right documents, even when those documents are in process, has caused many to be abducted from homes, schools, churches, and workplaces and incarcerated in not just uncomfortable facilities but what objective observers have called inhumane conditions. Just this past week, those who were recently welcomed here from Haiti and Syria have had their protected status undermined by our Supreme Court, and now a million more people could have the foundation of the new life they were invited to build here unexpectedly taken out from under them! This is not America the Beautiful that we should rightly love; it is rather America the heartless that we must work to change! Indeed, that sort of cruelty should be unacceptable to all people of goodwill and most especially abhorrent to people of a faith based in the teachings of Jesus Christ, no matter what denomination of Christianity with which they affiliate! On this 250th Anniversary of its founding, we must be grateful to our nation for the welcome given to our ancestors and thus for the rights, freedoms and opportunities that we enjoy today on account of it. Yet as Christians called to love our neighbor, including strangers, we should not passively condone shutting the door on law-abiding, hard-working, tax-paying newcomers; rather, we should be lobbying our lawmakers to create reasonable paths to citizenship that will enable them to stay just as our forebears were welcomed. To fail to see this, and to remain either indifferent or worse even hostile toward recent immigrants and their plight would convict us of a moral blindness of which it would be wise to repent! So as we celebrate America as Beautiful for what it promised those who came before us and has delivered for us, let us lobby to restore that same welcoming heart in our moral, social, and political culture in our nation as we embark on a new chapter of what we pray will be its long history.
