The Pastor's Pen

THE WEEKLY COLUMN BY FR. EDWARD HEALEY



When You Pray, Say?: The disciples were insecure about how they should pray so they asked Jesus to teach them, and as a result we have what we know as the Lord's Prayer. Yet in truth we have a translation of that prayer which comes to us from the early translations of the New Testament from Greek and Latin into English in the 15th century, and these may not be as precise as we may have thought. That became clear last Sunday when we read the Parable of the Merciless Servant and came to appreciate the connection between that parable and this prayer, as its lines actually refer to "debts" owed and forgiven rather than trespasses. But if we look further, we will find other subtle differences that are worth contemplating, as they may help to deepen the meaning of the Lord's Prayer for us.

According to language experts, this is a more accurate translation of the Lord's Prayer into English from the original Greek;

*Father of ours, the one in the heavens, let your name be held holy
(be sanctified)*

Let your kingdom (reign) come.

Let your will come to pass on earth as in heaven.

Give us today our supersubstantial bread,

and cancel us our debts as we also cancel the debts of our debtors.

And do not bring us into a time of trial (testing),

but rescue us from the evil one! Amen

The familiar doxology, as in "For thine is the kingdom, etc." is absent in original versions; this was added as the Lord's Prayer was prayed in the early Christian liturgies and so found its way into some early versions of the New Testament Scripture. So when we look at the original version of the Lord's Prayer a few things do stand out; we are not praying simply for sufficient bread to eat each day but rather for that bread the consumption of which has supernatural effects — which can only refer to the Holy Eucharist! Sin and forgiveness are expressed as debts and debt cancellations, just as in the Parable of the Merciless Servant. As we come to the end of the prayer, we realize that "lead us not into temptation" is a rather muddy translation of asking to be spared from a time of trial, implying a time of severe testing of our faith. Furthermore, we aren't just asking to be delivered from bad things in general but actually from the one who is the source of all evil itself.

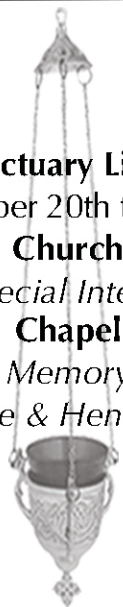

An Enjoyable Way to Help: On Monday, September 14th, the Christ the King Classic Golf Tournament was held at Willow Bend Country Club as 150 golfers assembled themselves into various teams to play this coveted course. Thanks are due to the golfers who participated and to our sponsors, especially the most generous among them, including Jim Bopp, John & Barbara Buckley, Deb Journalist, George & Thalia Logan, Jack & Cathy Brennan, The Palanza Group (designer & builder of our Pantry Project), and Bill Chapman of Chapman, Cole & Gleason Funeral Services. We must also thank the numerous donors to the silent auction, as we appreciate that the generous cooperation of players, sponsors, and donors made this event a significant financial success. A check for \$45,000 was presented to our Financial and Resources Assistance Ministry to assist the working poor here in this area of Cape Cod to obtain a home or keep the one they have by providing assistance with first and last monthly rents, security deposits, or a missed rent or mortgage payment. The Committee that takes responsibility for planning and organizing this event includes Jean Dennis, Deb Journalist, Joe Mooney, and the late Marion Mooney, who was involved in the planning before her passing in July. Thanks to all for a job very well done and for a successful tournament that is benefiting a very worthy charitable cause!

We Are Family Annual Campaign: We have hopes of reaching \$100,000 by Columbus Day Weekend so that it will be matched by a contribution of up to that same amount by very generous parishioners. As always, the proceeds from this annual collection are placed in our Building and Grounds Account to help meet the costs of any large capital expenses, which this year presently includes finishing the Pantry/Library project by replacing the sprinkler heads and pipes in the fire suppression system in the parish hall, which needs to be upgraded as it is no longer in compliance with present building codes and does not marry well with the system installed in the new construction. This is not a very noticeable investment, but it is a very necessary one, as it enables us to meet the requirements for the occupancy permit for the new construction!
